Workshop

Two-Day Seminar – 25th & 26th
October, 2025

Day 1: 'Find Early – Act Early' – by Dr. P. Sudhakar

An interactive and insightful sensitization workshop focusing on disabilities in children was organised by the SHARPEN Academy (SBIOA Educational Trust) for primary teachers. The session aimed to create awareness and deepen understanding among educators about the various developmental challenges and learning disabilities observed in young learners.

The workshop commenced with an introductory address by Dr. P. Sudhakar, a renowned paediatrician from Smilestones – A Centre for Child Development and Learning. He gave a comprehensive overview of the different sessions and introduced the speakers. Dr. Sudhakar briefly discussed the critical period of brain development and highlighted the red flag signs of abnormal behaviour in children, setting the stage for a day filled with meaningful learning and reflection.

Mr. Kaushik Ganguly, a distinguished Social Policy Specialist at UNICEF, shared valuable insights on child welfare and health. His words emphasized the importance of children's mental health and highlighted how society plays a vital role in fostering holistic development of every child.

The first session, led by Ms. Jincy, was both enlightening and informative. She elaborated on the various developmental stages and the different types of development that occur during each stage. Her presentation covered social and emotional development, language and communication development, physical development and activities of daily living skills. Ms. Jincy also listed a few abnormal signs to be noted during each developmental stage and illustrated several disabilities with apt examples, making the session highly engaging and educative.

The next speaker, Mrs. Oviya Thendral, delivered an insightful and dynamic session on Stuttering Disorder and Speech Sound Disorder. She explained the communication difficulties faced by children in their early years and demonstrated several speech-related disabilities along with their remedial measures. Her presentation was further enriched with real-life videos of her consultees and discussing their remarkable improvements, which greatly inspired the participants.

Following this, Mrs. Fazeela spoke passionately about the early symptoms that teachers should identify in students. She discussed ways to create a healthy learning environment and emphasised the importance of early intervention. Her talk shed light on the various symptoms of ADHD and autistic behaviour in children, highlighting how timely recognition can make a transformative difference in a child's educational journey.

The third session began with a thought-provoking role play by the teachers of SBIOA JC, creatively depicting real classroom challenges. Dr. P. Sudhakar then resumed the session with an in-depth discussion on Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). He pointed out the red flag signs of autism and elaborated on the areas of delayed development in children. Another role play was performed to demonstrate ADHD behaviour, making the session both interactive and experiential.

The final session, guided by Ms. Yeagasri S.S., focused on learning disabilities such as dyslexia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia, etc. This session offered a practical perspective on the challenges faced by the students and the teachers in the current educational scenario. It was an eye-opening discussion that highlighted the need for patience, awareness and inclusive teaching practices.

Towards the end of the workshop, participants were given an opportunity to clarify their doubts with Dr. P. Sudhakar, making it an engaging and collaborative conclusion. A teacher representative provided valuable feedback on the various sessions, appreciating the depth, relevance and practical application of the discussions.

The key takeaway from the workshop was a profound realization — disability is not a disorder; rather, it is a condition where timely support and understanding can empower students to achieve a better quality of life. It was an enriching and transformative experience, equipping teachers with the knowledge, empathy and sensitivity required to nurture every child with care and compassion.

Day 2: ‘Effective Communication in English’ – Basic Level

The second day of the seminar, held on 26th October, 2025, focused on Enhancing Communication Skills in English, conducted by the distinguished resource person, Mr. J. The session focused on the essential elements of effective communication in English -Action, Rhythm, and Intonation. The speaker highlighted how gestures, rhythm in speech, and correct intonation contribute significantly to impactful communication. These elements help in conveying meaning, emotion, and clarity while speaking.

The importance of correct tense usage was also emphasized as a cornerstone of effective communication. Practical examples were provided to demonstrate common tense errors and how to avoid them for improved grammatical accuracy. The seminar successfully achieved its objectives by equipping teachers with enhanced communicative skills and reinforcing the importance of rhythm, intonation and correct tense usage in effective English communication.

'World Postal Day' was observed on 10.10.2025. The students of UKG visited the Post Offices at Arasaradi and Nagamalai.



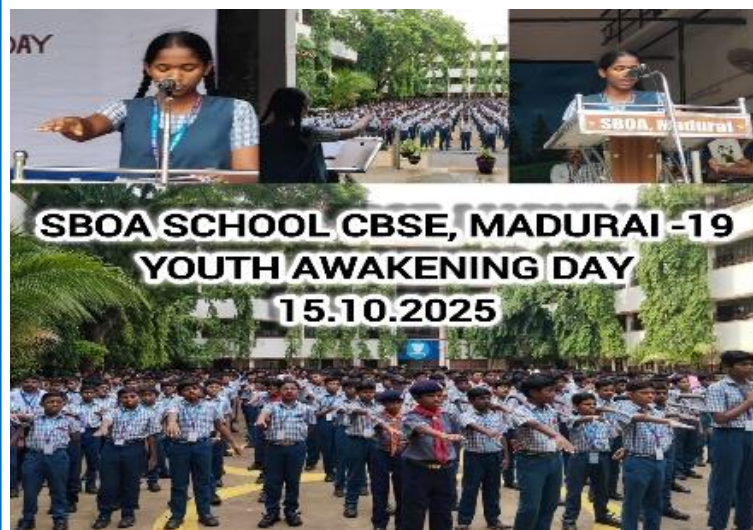

The workshop was highly useful and would help for the reconstructive methods to be followed in the Library.

Chennai: Volcano models made of cardboard are no longer the top-draw at science exhibitions in schools. Now, they have been replaced with prototypes of hydraulic robotic arms, AI-based detection cameras and wind-powered turbines.

The inter-district science exhibition 'Laser 25' hosted by Madras Christian College, Hatties Secondary School for classes VI-XII on Wednesday, showcased the engineering aptitude of students. A robot to assist the elderly, a fall detection system, and automatic attendance markers were among prototypes on display from about 62 schools in Chennai, Tiruvallur, Kanchipuram, and Chengalpattu.

The participants, in groups of two to three, were fascinated with displaying prototypes of science involving innovation.

Honourable Minister Mayyanathan Siva presented prizes to Rayyan M.J. (Class 6F) and Kaharshwa S. (Class 6J) at Madras Christian College (MCC) during the LASER 2025 Tech Competition. 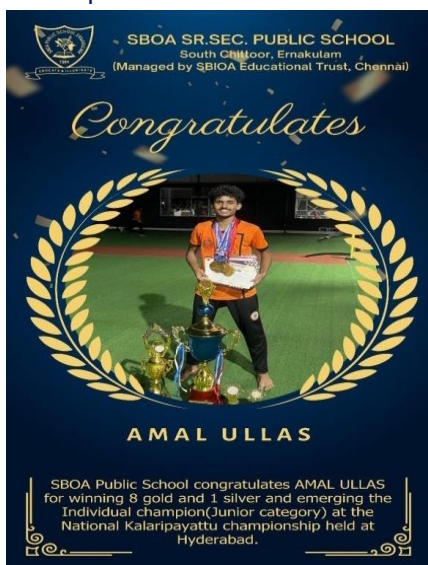




On 28th October, 2025, Language Day was celebrated. The students presented speeches, poems and skits highlighting the richness and beauty of language.

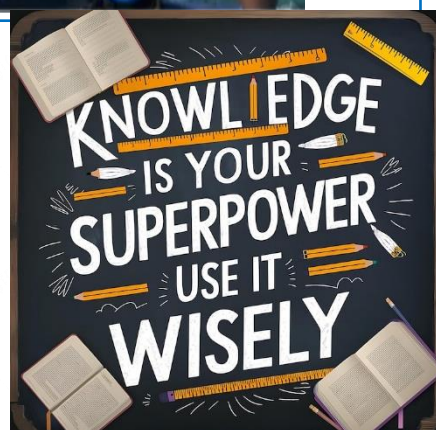
